SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

ROUND 1 2018/2019

1st OF DECEMBER 2018

1. THE EVENT:

The Event shall be known as the ROUND 1 2018/2019 "MOTORKHANA SERIES 2018/2019", here in after to be known as the Event. The Event will be a **Multi Club Motorkhana** and will be conducted at THE MOUNT GAMBIER SHOWGROUNDS on an UNSEALED SURFACE. The event will be organised and promoted by the South Eastern Automobile Club of South Australia Inc., P.O. Box 1551, Mount Gambier, and is open to current members of the SEAC and any club that is affiliated with CAMS and are holders of a CAMS level 2NS or 2NSJ licence or superior.

2. AUTHORITY:

The Event will be conducted under the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), the National Motorkhana Code (NMC), Schedule A and Group 4H Regulations, "Motorkhana Series 2018" Standing Regulations, the CAMS Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) Policy, the CAMS Come & Try Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations or Instructions which may be issued.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S, CAMS Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au.

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance are provided by CAMS in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.

7. ENTRIES:

Entries OPEN	On publication of these Supplementary Regulations.
Entries CLOSE	29 th of November at 6:30pm.
Venue	Mount Gambier Showgrounds
Scrutiny	1 st of December from 1:30pm to 2:30pm
Drivers Briefing	1 st of December at 2:45pm
Event Start	1 st of December at 3:00pm

The entry fee is \$22 for adult drivers and \$12 for junior drivers.
Cheques are to be made payable to the SEAC and addressed to the "Event Secretary".
Weekend club membership is \$25.50 per person which can be purchased once per annum.
The maximum number of competitors shall be 50, chosen from the first 50 in order of receipt of completed and fully paid entries.

8. SCRUTINY DETAILS:

Scrutiny will be conducted between 1:30pm and 2:30pm on the day of the Event at the venue. Current CAMS Licence (L2NS or superior), current membership card, competition record and log book (if issued) must be presented at scrutiny.

Drivers briefing will take place at 2:45pm. Competition starts at 3:00pm.

The rotation of the field will be notified at the drivers briefing.

9. DRIVERS:

As per Motorkhana Series 2018/2019 Standing Regulations.

10. JUDGES OF FACT:

An Official shall be appointed to be the Judge of Fact, whose duty it is to decide when or whether an automobile has touched or passed a given line. Judges of Fact will be the Clerk of the Course, Stewards, Timers, Starters and Observers.

11. REFUSAL OF ENTRY:

As per the NCR83 an entry for a competition held under these rules, other than an International Competition, may be refused in accordance with the Supplementary Regulations relating to such competition, prior to the meeting and within three days after the date set for the close of entries.

12. VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS:

As per the NMC Regulations, Schedule A and Group 4H of the 2018 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Fuel shall be in accordance with Schedule G. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.

13. JUNIOR CLUB CAR:

As per Motorkhana Series 2018 Standing Regulations.

14. TYRES:

As per Motorkhana Series 2018 Standing Regulations.

15. PASSENGERS:

This Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the CAMS MSPRA Policy.

- (a) A briefing must be attended by each Driver and Passenger (and guardians of each Passenger if Passenger is under 18 years of age) conducted by the Clerk of the Course prior to the MSPRA commencing.
- (b) Passengers MUST:
 - i. wear the same protective gear as a Driver
 - ii. Be fitted and restrained as required for each Automobile with consideration for their physical attributes
 - iii. Complete a Passenger Ride Entry Form and Disclaimer
 - iv. Drivers must fill out a Passenger Ride Entry Form to ride as a Passenger.
 - v. Be at least 12 years of age
- (c) Vehicles and Apparel used must pass Scrutiny.
- (d) Vehicles shall only carry one Passenger at a time, unless otherwise approved by CAMS.

16. CLASSES:

Class C	Production cars	2301mm - 2575mm, wheel base, 2wd EAD.

Class J	Juniors	
Class NJ	Novice Junior	
Master	Additional class for Males 60+ and Females 55+ at the 1 st of January. One trophy for highest ranked	

- Notes:
1. Juniors are defined as being less than 18 years of age on the 1st of January, having attained the age of 12 years. Refer 10.8 of NMC. All Juniors and Novice Juniors will be handicap on the car they are driving but will remain in the Juniors or Novice Juniors class.
 2. Junior competitors who turn 18 during the season and still competing as a junior shall only pay junior entry fees for that season.
 3. Novices are defined as junior competitors in their first full year of competition.

21. PROTESTS:

Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current CAMS Manual.

22. ABANDONMENT:

Event Organisers reserve the right to cancel, abandon or postpone the Event in accordance with NCR 59 of the current CAMS Manual.

23. PRACTICE/COME & TRY

At the end of official competition, for a maximum of one hour, the Director may allow club members with a Level 2NS or superior CAMS license to practice on the course with the aim of learning the art of motorkhana.

Adult passengers (club member & L2NS or superior licence) may be taken to assist the driver in learning aspects of motorkhana (the Clerk of the Course will need to authorise each passenger and the Stewards will be present as each car must pass scrutiny).

This section will also be used as a Come & Try component of the event which will enable new participants to experience motorsport in a safe environment. Level 1 SE (single event) licenses will be available for the new participants and can be obtained from the organiser for \$25. This licence is only valid for one Event per year and can only be used in the non-competitive section of the Event.

24. ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty/ies for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
