SEAC RALLYCROSS 2020 - Date: 3rd Oct 20



1. SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

To be read in conjunction with the current Motorsport Australia Manual, the Rallycross Standing Regulations, bulletins or instructions issued by the Organizers.

These Supplementary Regulations will take precedence over any item where conflicting Instructions are identified.

2. AUTHORITY

The Event will be conducted under the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, The Speed Event Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations and Bulletins which may be issued by the Organizers.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au

3. THE EVENT:

The Event will be a **Multiclub Rallycross** Event, known as the 'SEAC Rallycross" herein after referred to as 'the Event'.

The Event will be conducted on the Motorsport Australia sanctioned tracks on private property, being SEAC Park, Megaw Road, Compton, S.A. from the 19th Oct 19.

Course length - 1.2km. Surface type – dirt. The Event shall be in a clockwise or anticlockwise direction.

7. DEFINITION OF A RALLYCROSS:

Rallycross is a type of speed competition, but is not a race, involving one to four automobiles simultaneously and conducted on a track with a combination of sealed and unsealed surfaces and/or obstacles.

8. PASSENGERS

Passengers are not permitted for Rallycross events.

9. CREW ELIGIBILITY

Rallvcross 1

Drivers must hold a minimum of a Motorsport Australia Level 2S Speed licence and must be able to demonstrate previous competition in at least one Autocross, Sprint or Supersprint event held on a closed circuit (e.g. not a straight line sprint)

<u>Juniors</u>

Drivers must hold a Motorsport Australia Level 2SJ – Ages 14 years and up to and including 17 years Juniors may only drive a restricted class vehicle (see Technical Regulations) unless approved by COC,

Rallycross 2

Drivers will be required to hold one of the following:-

- Motorsport Australia Licences and (if not competing with a Licence eligible for racing) must have passed the Motorsport Australia On-line Licence Lecture or to have attended a face-to-face lecture:
- Circuit (NC,PC,CC,PCC), or
- Rally (NR, CR), or
- · Off Road (NO, NOS), or
- A licence of superior status, or
- An equivalent status licence issued by a FIA affiliated ASN

10. ENTRIES:

Rallycross Entry Fee for Juniors (age 14 to 18 years) is \$ 35.00 (GST inclusive)

Rallycross 1 Entry Fee for Senior (age 18 plus) is \$70.00 (GST inclusive)

Rallycross 2 Entry Fee for Senior (age 18 plus) is \$70.00 (GST inclusive)

Only fully completed entries will be accepted

There will be <u>no entries and payment</u> accepted after the Entry Close date.

Participant / Competitors who do not start the Event will have their Entry Fee refunded.

Entries submitted online via the South Eastern Automobile Club website, www.seacsa.com. The Motorsport Australia Disclaimer must be handed in prior to entry to the event. must be signed by the Competitor and Driver(s) and submitted on arrival to Pits on competition day.

Cheques should be made payable to 'South Eastern Automobile Club' (SEAC)

Participants are reminded of the penalties under NCR for false statements.

Participants under the age of 18 must have written consent of Parent of Guardian to enter and participate.

The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 83.

The field will be limited to the first 60 correctly written and paid entries received by the Secretary.

Entries will be limited to 2 Drivers per vehicle.

11. STARTING ORDER & PROCEDURE:

Starting Orders

Each driver and automobile is considered to have come under "Starter's Orders" on arrival at the start grid. Having come under starter's orders, such driver and automobile shall be considered to have started. Failure to proceed to the allocated start line on the grid when directed to do so may involve forfeiture of the run.

Starting Procedure

Automobiles will start two at a time for Rallycross 1 and four at a time for Rallycross 2 from a Rolling Start, Start procedure will be Explained at the competition.

Jumping the Start

A driver starting when red lights are illuminated, or before the start flag is raised, shall be penalized 30 seconds, which is added to the drivers time for the event

The stewards shall have the power to increase any specified penalty and/or to apply other penalties.

12. RUNNING DETAILS:

HEATS

Automobiles from different categories and type in Rallycross 1, will run separately in the heats, placings allocated after each heat has been run and drivers will be allocated points. Total of points over 4 heats will determine placings on the day.

Automobiles that have left the track may only return to the track when it is safe to do so, taking into account the presence of other automobiles.

Drivers who deliberately shorten the course to gain an advantage shall incur a time penalty of 30 seconds per offence.

Rallycross 1 and Rallycross 2

The competition will consist of heats only and the general classification shall be based on the total number of points over the 4 heats, plus penalties, if any.

The winner will be the driver with the highest aggregate points score from all 4 heats.

Where drivers have equal points at the end of the 4 heats the higher place will be awarded to the driver who has the fastest time in heat 4.

JOKER ROUTE

In each heat one of the laps must include the Joker Route. The penalty for a driver who does not take the Joker Route once will be 30 seconds.

The penalty for a driver taking the Joker Route more than once in a heat will be 30 seconds. Judges of fact will be appointed to record which automobiles pass through the Joker Route, and how many times.

GRID

No work may be carried out on automobiles on the grid, except on the grounds of safety, and only with the approval of the Chief Scrutineer.

Rallycross 1

The grid shall consist of Four automobiles, with left and right sides of the grid alternated as necessary in the heats, staggered start 2 x 2

If there is a non-starter/s the starting position/s on the grid remains vacant. Position 1 is determined by Fastest Time in Qualifying 2 Laps, Position 2 is the second fastest time from qualifying and so on


Rallycross 2

The grid shall consist of four automobiles, with left and right sides of the grid alternated as necessary In heats

13. FINISH PROCEDURE:

At the end of each run the Driver is to immediately decelerate the vehicle and proceed to the Pit Area via the Track Exit, **stopping at the stop sign**, before proceeding to the Pits. At all times when moving within the Pit Area and leaving the Autocross area, the maximum speed limit is to be 10kph.

14. DRIVERS BRIEFING:

A meeting of all Participants/Competitors for a Drivers Briefing shall be called as per the 'Schedule of Dates' prior to the commencement of the day's Event, by the Organisers to elucidate regulations, allot starting times etc.

15. DOCUMENTATION AND SCRUTINY:

Participants/Competitors must present the relevant current Motorsport Australia Competitor Licences. Drivers will be required to also present Motorsport Australia Vehicle Log Books, if applicable, and current Motorsport Australia affiliated Club Membership Cards.

Scrutiny will be conducted as per the 'Schedule of Dates' on the day of the Event, at the Venue in the Pits Area. Social Distancing Applies.

Vehicles must comply with Schedule A and B of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

Vehicles will be scrutineered for safety, general requirements, noise and eligibility.

Any vehicle damaged during the Event will be re-scrutineered before being allowed to restart in the Event

No vehicle will be allowed to participate with a defective exhaust.

Tyre types allowed are street tyres and semi slick type tyres. No rally or knob type's tyres allowed.

16. RESTRICTIONS

Under no circumstances should anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 attend the event. This includes any fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, fatigue, or lack of sense of smell.

Under no circumstances should anyone attend the event if they have been:

- i. overseas / Interstate where required to isolate in the previous 14 days: or
- ii. in contact with someone who has been overseas in the previous 14 days: or in contact with a known COVID-19 positive case in the previous 14 days

17. SERVICE AND REFUELLING

Available commercial pump fuel only shall be used in accordance with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.

Servicing will be undertaken only in designated Pits Area.

Refuelling will be undertaken only in the designated Refuel Area

Vehicle speed in the Pits Area must not exceed 10km/h, breaches will be reported to the Stewards of the Event

18. JUDGES OF FACT:

In accordance with NCR 181 the following Officials are deemed to be Judges of Fact:

Officials of the Event are deemed to be Judges of Fact of the following:

- · Not wearing seatbelt, helmet or safety clothing
- · Failure to follow the prescribed course
- Service/Pit Area infringements
- Speeding in Service/Pit Area
- · Hitting or movement of course makers
- · Excessive vehicle speed

Scrutineers are deemed to be Judges of Fact of the following;

- Vehicle unsafe to start/continue
- Weight of a vehicle
- · Eligibility of Vehicles
- Driver Apparel

Medical Officers are deemed to be Judges of Fact of the Medical condition

of any Crew Member or Team Member

19. VEHICLE CLASS:

Type 1 Autocross Automobiles (grid of 1 to 2) Rear Wheel Drive/Front Wheel Drive/4WD Type 2 Rallycross Automobiles (grid of 1 to 4) Rear Wheel Drive/Front Wheel Drive/4WD Automobiles shall be classified as follows: Category: Autocross & Rallycross

20. METHOD OF SCORING:

Timing will:

- Be carried out to an accuracy of 0.1 second;
- Commence concurrently for all automobiles in an event
- Timing equipment in use for Race Meetings will be the only official times for Results No third party equipment will be recognised to determine results

Pointscores:

All Classes:-

All the heats (4) will be timed and the fastest driver in each heat will be awarded 50 points, the second fastest 45 points, the third fastest 42 points, the fourth fastest 40 points, the fifth fastest 39 points, the sixth fastest 38 points, the seventh fastest 37 points and so on. Those drivers who did not complete a heat "DNF" will be credited with a total of points equal to the number of points that the slowest driver would be given, less one point.

Supposing that all the starters in the Competition were classified, those drivers who did not start the Heat "DNS" and those drivers who were excluded "EXC" from the heat will not be credited with any points.

If a race is restarted, a Driver who started in the first or subsequent starts, but was not able to start in the race that was completed, will be shown as "DNF" instead of "DNS" and will be credited with the appropriate number of points

Known non-starters will be omitted from the published grid sheet. After the first race in a heat has started, a non-starter in a later race will only be replaced if his absence means that the race has fewer than three starters.

After the heats, there will be an intermediate classification according to each driver's total points scored in the Four heats.

In the event of tied positions in the intermediate classification, precedence will be given to the drivers(s) who were the fastest in the 4th heat. To appear in this intermediate classification a Driver must have crossed the finish line and been duly classified in at least two heats

21. PROTEST:

Rallycross Event protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current NCR and accompanied by the appropriate Fee.

22. ABANDONMENT:

If necessary, abandonment, postponement or cancellation will be in accordance with NCR 59 of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.

23. AWARDS:

Awards will be presented at the discretion of the Event Director / Clerk of Course

24. ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES:

Any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

25. SOCIAL MEDIA

Social Media, the Internet and all forms of social media including text is not anonymous. Any Competitor found to transmit images or comments regarding incidents, accidents, negative remarks or other items that could be deemed to be considered sensitive will be referred to the Stewards of the Event with the recommendation of exclusion from the Event. Further information may be included within the Drivers Briefing and remind all Competitors to respect the privacy of others and use common sense.
