SCRUTINEERING TIME	Scrutiny will be via the Motorsport Australia Self-Scrutiny Checklist and Self-Scrutiny Statement of Vehicle Compliance forms. These need to be filled out and emailed to the secretary at sales@simseng.net prior to the start of the event. Preferably before entries close. If you are unable to scan and email drop them to the office on a Thursday.		

- As per the Autotest NMC Regulations all vehicles must comply with Schedule A and Group 4K of the Motorsport Australia Manual
- Approved helmets and apparel, in accordance with Schedule D of the Motorsport Australia Manual
- Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual
- Cars must be adequately muffled and comply with noise restrictions
- Competitors must produce a valid and current:
 - Motorsport Australia Competition Licence
 - Licence Club Membership Card of a Motorsport Australia Affiliated Car Club
 - Log Book (if issued)

<p>TYRES</p>	<p>Only street tyres are permitted on grass or unsealed events. No bar treads, block treads, winter treads, off road aggressive type treads or tyres with a square shoulder will be permitted. No traction additives will be permitted. For bitumen events tyres used are open but must not have canvas or steel showing. Spare tyres, which may be used during the event, shall be scrutinized along with the vehicle.</p>
<p>VEHICLES WITHOUT WINDSCREENS</p>	<p>Drivers of vehicles without windscreens must wear appropriate eye-protection as per Motorsport Australia requirements and South Eastern Automobile Club Motorkhana Series 2022 Standing Regulations</p>
<p>PASSENGERS</p>	<p>Junior competitors may request a Motorsport Australia Speed Licensed or superior. SEAC member as a passenger/instructor for the non-competitive component of the event. Approval must be given from the Clerk of the Course prior to any passenger entering a vehicle. Passengers must sign a "Passenger in Vehicle Disclaimer Form" (even if they are also a driver on the day) The Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy.</p>
<p>METHOD OF SCORING A handicap system will apply in 2022</p>	<p>The handicap is applied before any penalties and is as follows: Class A, 0.90 Class B, 0.88 Class C, 0.86 Class D, 0.84 Class E, 0.92 Class F, no handicap Juniors and Novice Juniors will be handicapped on the car they are driving but will remain in the junior or novice junior class Competitors will be scored on 4 out of the 5 events. Your worst round will be dropped at the end of the season if you competed in all rounds in the 2022 series</p>
<p>VARIATIONS TO MOTORKHANA REGULATIONS:</p>	<p>(a) Clause 13.4 (viii) which deals with penalties for 'striking a marker', is varied with the addition of the words, "and significantly displaced from its original position". (b) Clause 13.4 (iv) that deals with reversing after crossing a designated finish line, the penalty is changed to "plus five seconds". (c) Every marker knocked carries a separate penalty of "plus 5 seconds". (d) Diagrams may be provided for each course.</p>

Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of any drug or other banned substance and subject to a penalty for a breach of the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.

Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day. The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.

COVID or other PANDEMICS:

South Eastern Automobile Club run Motorkhana Series 2022 will be following guidelines as issued by Federal and State Governments and Motorsport Australia (return to race) as the need arises. These may include but are not limited to, requirement to complete covid declaration form, sign in if required, abide by current physical distancing rules, don't attend if you are unwell, obey all directives given by officials. Whilst not a requirement yet it may be that you will need to be double vaccinated during the course of the year to compete. If this happens you will also be required to provide proof of your vaccination status.
