- First and foremost, it must be stated that drivers, officials and spectators MUST comply with all the current COVID 19 restrictions that are in place at the time of the event.
- This includes, but not limited to, social distancing and hand hygiene etc.
- All persons onsite at the event must comply with the Motorsport Australia "Return to Race" strategy
 which is available to download via their website www.motorsport.org.au.
- A COVID-19 compliance checker will be onsite and can stop the event until a non-conformance is rectified.
- Public address system will be used for drivers briefing.
- Self scrutineering forms must be completed.
- If you are unwell leading up to, or on the day of the event, PLEASE STAY AT HOME.

1. THE EVENT:

The Event shall be known as "LCORC 2022 Khanacross & SEAC Round 1", herein after to be known as the Event. The Club Khanacross Event will be conducted at 33375 PRINCESS HIGHWAY, COMPTON.

The Event will be Organised and Promoted by Limestone Coast OffRoad Club Inc. PO Box 606, Mount Gambier, and is open only to current members of the LCORC and any club that is affiliated with Motorsport Australia and are holders of a Motorsport Australia SPEED or SPEED JUNIOR Licence or Superior. The Event will also incorporate a member recruitment Come and Try component and Practice Section.

2. AUTHORITY:

The Event will be conducted under the provisions of the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Motorsport Australia, the Motorsport Australia Khanacross Regulations and Group 4H Regulations, "Khanacross Series 2022 Standing Regulations. This event will be conducted under and in accordance with any and all necessary Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Return to Race strategy requirements, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations or Instructions, which may be issued.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

Online Entries via Motorsport Australia website www.motorsport.org.au are the only method of entry.

The maximum number of competitors shall be 40, chosen from the first 40 in order of receipt of completed and fully paid entries.

9. RUNNING DETAILS:

Documents also to be sent to the Event Secretary are current club membership card, and Motorsport Australia Log Book (if issued).

Drivers Briefing will take place at 9:45am. Competition starts at 10.00am.

The rotation of the field will be notified at the Drivers Briefing.

10. DRIVERS & APPAREL

All Drivers must wear appropriate clothing, and enclosed footwear as per Schedule D. Drivers of vehicles without windscreens must wear appropriate eye-protection as per Motorsport Australia requirements. All Drivers must wear a helmet complying with Schedule D of the General Requirements in the current Motorsport Australia Manual. All drivers must attend the Drivers Briefing.

11. JUDGES OF FACT:

An Official(s) shall be appointed to be the Judge of Fact, whose duty it is to decide when or whether an automobile has touched or passed a given line. Judges of Fact will be the Clerk of the Course, Stewards, Timers, Starters and Observers.

12. REFUSAL OF ENTRY:

Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR's of the current Motorsport Australia Manual, or in accordance to these Supplementary Regulations relating to such competition, prior to the meeting and within three days after the set date for the close of entries.

13. VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS:

As per the <u>Motorsport Australia Manual</u>, Schedule A and Group 4H Regulations. A Fire extinguisher of at least 900Grams, complying with Schedule H of the Motorsport Australia Manual must be fitted. Fuel shall be in accordance with Schedule G. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.

14. TYRES:

All tyres are permitted at this Event. Spare tyres, which may be used during the Event, shall be Scrutinised along with the Vehicle. Vehicles classified as specials in Group 4H must not have more than two driven wheels or more than two steered wheels .Only street tyres are permitted for SEAC series points.

15. CLASSES:

Classes for the " 2022 KHANACROSS " shall be :

Class A:	2WD Production Cars	up to 1300cc
Class B:	2WD Production Cars	1301cc to 1600cc
Class C:	2WD Production Cars	1601cc to 2000cc
Class D:	2WD Production Cars	2001cc to 3000cc
Class E:	2WD Production Cars	3001cc and above

Class F: Specials & 4WD/AWD

Class J: Juniors

Notes:

- 1. Juniors are defined as being over 12 but less than 18 years of age on the 1st of January.

 All competitors driving a Special will compete in the Special Class F except juniors and novice juniors who will still stay in their class. 12 and 13 year old juniors cannot compete in a special in Khanacross.
- 2. Junior competitors who turn 18 during the season and still competing as a junior shall only pay junior entry fees for that season.
- 3. Novices are defined as junior competitors in their first year of competition.
- 4. Juniors 12 and 13 years old <u>MUST</u> have a Motorsport Australia licensed senior club member in the vehicle for all tests. Passengers must comply with section 15 of the Supplementary Regulations.

16. METHOD OF SCORING:

Placings shall be decided on the aggregate of elapsed time on the tests completed, plus any penalties. The winner(s) shall be the driver(s) having the lowest aggregate, including any penalties, at the completion of the Event. In the case of equal scores, the tied competitors shall be declared joint winners.

17. AWARDS:

- 1. A "Series Champion Award" will be presented to the competitor with the greatest number of accumulated points at the end of the Series.
- 2. Aggregate Series Class Awards will be made first, second & third, providing competitor numbers justify such awards.

18. VARIATIONS TO KHANACROSS REGULATIONS:

Penalties.

- (a) Clause 17.4 (1) which deals with penalties for 'striking a marker', is varied with the addition of the words, "and significantly displaced from its original position".
- (b) Clause 13.5 (1) that deals with reversing after crossing a designated finish line, the penalty is changed to "plus five seconds".

20. PROTESTS:

Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

21. ABANDONMENT:

The Organisers reserve the right to postpone or abandon the Event under the provision of the NCR.

22. COME & TRY

There will no come and try activities at this event.

23. ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of any drug or other banned substance and subject to a penalty for a breach of the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy at www.motorsport.org.au. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day. The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at www.motorsport.org.au.
