



SEAC 2026 KHANACROSS SERIES - ROUND 1

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Saturday 28th February 2026

1. THE EVENT: The Event shall be known as SEAC 2026 Khanacross Series Round 1. The Khanacross Event will be conducted at the Heywood Recreation Reserve, Heywood, Victoria. The Promoter and Organiser of the Event is the South Eastern Automobile Club of South Australia Inc. (SEAC), PO Box 1551, Mount Gambier, and is open to current members of Motorsport Australia affiliated clubs who are holders of a Motorsport Australia Speed/Speed Junior licence or superior.

2. AUTHORITY: The Event is to be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia. The Event will be conducted under the SEAC 2026 Khanacross Series Standing Regulations, the Khanacross Standing Regulations, the Motorsport Australia Passenger Ride Activity, the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any further Regulations, Bulletins or Instructions that may be issued. This Event will be held in accordance with Motorsport Australia's Occupational Health and Safety Policy, Integrity Policies, Legal Policies, Risk Management Policies, Safety 1st Framework and any other relevant Policy. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia. 4. ENTRIES: **OPEN:** Upon publication of the Supplementary Regulations
CLOSE: Tuesday 24th February 2026 11.59PM ACST
VENUE: Heywood Recreation Reserve (unsealed surface)
SCRUTINY & CHECK-IN: Saturday 28th February 2026 9.30AM to 10.30AM ACST
DRIVERS BRIEFING: Saturday 28th February 2026 10.45AM ACST
EVENT START: At the conclusion of the Drivers Briefing
EVENT FINISH: Approximately 5.30PM ACST

A current club membership and Motorsport Australia licence must be presented at check-in.

The entry fee is \$50.00 for adult competitors and \$30.00 for Junior competitors. All entry fees include GST. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE COMPLETED VIA THE MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA WEBSITE by Tuesday 24th February 2026 11.59PM ACST.

Payment to be made via Electronic Funds Transfer to the account details provided in the entry confirmation email. Please use the reference 'KX Surname'. Competitors are required to provide proof of payment if requested.

The maximum number of entries shall be 50, chosen from the first 50 entries in order of receipt and fully paid entries.

5. RUNNING DETAILS: Scrutiny and Check-In will be conducted at the venue between 9.30AM and 10.30AM ACST on the day of the Event. Documents to be presented are current Motorsport Australia licence, current Club Membership and competition record and log book (if issued). Drivers Briefing will be conducted at 10.45AM ACST with competition commencing at the conclusion of the Drivers Briefing. Running order will be notified at the Drivers Briefing.

6. DRIVERS: All competitors must wear appropriate clothing, **helmet** and enclosed footwear in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Technical Appendix – Schedule D. Drivers of vehicles without windscreens must wear goggles or a visor in accordance with Motorsport Australia Technical Appendix – Schedule D. All Drivers must attend the Drivers Briefing.

7. JUDGES OF FACT: All Officials, including but not limited to the Clerk of the Course, Assistant Clerk of the Course, Starters, Timers and Observers, are deemed to be Judges of Fact in determining whether an Automobile has touched a course marker, passed a given line or started or stopped as required.

8. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: Entries may be refused in accordance with the National Competition Rules, prior to The Event and within 3 days of the Close of Entries.

9. VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS: As per the Motorsport Australia Khanacross Standing Regulations, Schedule A and Group 4K. A fire extinguisher of at least 1 kilogram must be fitted in accordance with the requirements of a Hand-Held Extinguisher within Motorsport Australia Technical Appendix – Schedule H, including the manner of fitment and accessibility. Fuel shall be in accordance with Schedule G. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.

10. TYRES: Only Street tyres are permitted. No bar treads, block treads, winter treads, off-road aggressive type treads or tyres with a square shoulder will be permitted. No traction additives will be permitted. Spare tyres which may be used during the event, shall be scrutinised along with the Automobile. The Scrutineers and Clerk of the Course will have final say on tyre eligibility.

11. PASSENGERS: The Event will include a Motorsport Australia Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy. In addition, a Competitor may request a Passenger for the purpose of instruction/guidance subject to the following:

- 11.1.1 An inexperienced Driver (including a Junior) may carry an experienced Passenger, or an experienced Driver may carry an inexperienced Passenger (including a Junior).
- 11.1.2 A request must be lodged with the Clerk of the Course who will determine the suitability of the Passenger or the experience of the Driver prior to approval.
- 11.1.3 Each Passenger must complete the Motorsport Australia Passenger in Vehicle Disclaimer Form before any Test, even if they are a Driver for the Event.
- 11.1.4 Only one Passenger is permitted in the Automobile with the Driver at any time during a Test.
- 11.1.5 Each Passenger must comply with the apparel and safety requirements for the Event during any attempt at a Test.

Junior and Novice Junior Competitors aged less than 14 years of age must have a Motorsport Australia licenced Passenger holding a Speed Licence or superior as a Passenger in the Automobile for all Tests.

12. CLASSES: Classes for the 2026 Khanacross Series shall be:

Class A	Production Cars up to 1800cc
Class B	Production Cars 1801cc to 2500cc
Class C	Production Cars 2501cc to 4000cc
Class D	Production Cars 4001cc and above
Class E	Production Cars Non-Turbo 4WD/AWD
Class F	Specials & Production Cars Turbo 4WD/AWD
Class J	Juniors
Class NJ	Novice Juniors

1. Juniors are defined as a Competitor who is at least 12 years of age and less than 18 years of age on the first day of an Event.
2. Novice Juniors are Junior Competitors in their first calendar year of competition.
3. Novice Junior Competitors aged less than 17 years of age must have Motorkhana or other motorsport competition experience. The Clerk of the Course may reject entries from Novice Junior Competitors who do not have appropriate experience.
4. Competitors driving a Special will compete in Class F.
5. Competitors may only compete in one Automobile.

13. METHOD OF SCORING: Placings shall be decided on the aggregate of elapsed times on all tests, plus any penalties. The winner shall be the Competitor having the lowest aggregate, including any penalties, at the conclusion of the Event. In the case of equal scores at the completion of the Event, the winner will be decided on a count-back format.

14. SEAC AWARDS: A Series Champion Award will be presented to the SEAC Competitor with the highest aggregate of the round points for the Series. Aggregate Series Class Awards will be made for first, second

and third SEAC Competitor, providing Competitor numbers justify such Awards. Competitors must complete the greater of three rounds or 75% of the Series to be eligible for Awards. Points from all Events of the Series will be used to calculate Series points.

15. VARIATIONS TO KHANACROSS STANDING REGULATIONS: Section 12.1 which details penalties for 'Striking a marker' is varied with the addition of the words 'and displaced from its original position'. Diagrams may be provided for each course and/or Parade laps.

16. CATERING: The Event is conducted in conjunction with the Wood, Wine and Roses Festival. A lunch break will be taken during the day with food vendors on site.

17. PROTESTS: Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

18. ABANDONMENT: The Organiser reserves the right to postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR.

19. COME & TRY: This Event will offer Come and Try activities in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Events Policy. The Come and Try component of the Event is available to anyone 12 years or older who has not previously held a Motorsport Australia licence. Come and Try participants must be a member of a Motorsport Australia club or purchase a single-day membership, along with a single day Motorsport Australia Introductory Licence. The Come and Try activities are non-competitive, participants will run separately to competing participants, their runs will not be timed, results will not be published and no awards or prizes will be offered.

20. INTEGRITY:

Smoking (including e-cigarettes and vaping) and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling or defueling operation.

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and relevant Policies, including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy, Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy and the Alcohol Policy, apply to any activity sanctioned by Motorsport Australia.

Any participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

21. DRONE: A drone may be in use at the Event, with the operator holding the appropriate licence. An area away from Competitors and spectators will be designated for landing and take-off.
